Welcome new piano students to the <u>2019-2020</u> school year at Allegro Charter School! This is an introductory course for beginner piano students.

Goals/Objectives

- Learn beginner piano technique for the left and right hands
- Gain solo and ensemble performance skills
- Read and notate music on the treble & bass clefs
- Perform piano music from a variety of styles and periods that is appropriate to individual ability
- Compose original music using traditional notation
- Improvise simple melodies
- Respond to performances through writing and discussion

Textbook

Piano Adventures Primer and Beginner Level (provided for in-class use)

Required Materials

- Charged iPad or school issued computer
- Loose leaf paper
- Pencils
- 3 ring binder or folder within a multi-subject binder

Grading

- 15% Participation
 - (arrive on time, complete bellwork, follow instructions, stay on task)

- 20% Written Work
 - (classwork that is not completed in class becomes homework)
- 25% Quiz/Small Project
- 40% **Project/Test**

Classroom Expectations

- Respect your classmates, teacher and the equipment
- Communicate with your teacher if you have any issues or concerns
- Arrive on time with a CHARGED iPad, loose leaf paper and a pencil
- Use your time wisely—stay on task
- Make every effort to turn in assignments on time
- Food and flavored drinks are not permitted
 - Water in a sealable container may be kept on the classroom storage shelf and never near piano equipment

Late assignment penalty

- -10 points for the first day late
- -5 points for each additional day
- Late assignment cut off:
 - Assignments will receive an automatic grade zero if turned in more than six days late.
- *Exemptions* may include:
 - IEP/504 accommodations
 - Excused absences: All assignments are still expected to be completed within 2 days upon returning from an excused absence.
 - Technology issue that is being addressed by Mr. Baum or an administrator

Benchmarks

• In each ensemble and music course, students will be required to take a benchmark test two times throughout the year. Each ensemble will take the test on the same day. The purpose of the benchmark test is to assess a student's growth in music and to assist those who may be in need of help. If a student fails to show growth or fails to pass their benchmark tests, then their parents will be notified and the student will be required to attend tutoring in addition to attending regular meetings with the department head

and administration. The first benchmark test will take place on November 21st and the second test will take place on April 2nd.
